CLASS	DESCRIPTION
<u>Fall Garden/Landscape</u> <u>Prep Course</u>	Brenton Breland with the MSU Extension Office will offer a FREE workshop for us the morning of our September luncheon. This program will educate attendees on common tasks needed to maintain gardens and landscapes in MS in the fall. Topics include weed/herbicide recommendations, planting/varieties and much more
Palette Knife Painting	Acrylic painting class taught by Allison Viator. You will learn how to paint using a palette knife as your brush to create texture within your painting.
Fall Wreath Making Class	Come join the fun with Kelly Hart from The Flower Nook to create your very own fall door wreathall supplies are included.
Beginning Sewing/Embroidery	Learn how to make a pillowcase and an apron in this class. For the pillowcase, student will need to bring 3 coordinating cotton fabrics (no silk or flannel), 3/4 yd for main fabric, 1/4 yd for cuff fabric, and 1/4 yd of accent fabric. This is for one pillowcase; if you plan to make a second pillowcase at home, you will need to purchase 1 1/2 yd of main fabric and 1/2 yd cuff fabric (the 1/4 yd of the accent fabric is enough for two pillowcases). For the apron, student will need to bring 1 3/4 yd of cotton fabric. The best place to purchase fabric is Gardensong Fabrics in Brookhaven. You can purchase from Hobby Lobby, but purchase only fabric that is on the bolt, not precut.
<u>Health Symposium/Health</u> <u>Fair</u>	Healthy people are foundational to a healthy community. This health fair aims to launch new wellness initiatives, share health education information, conduct preventive screenings, raise awareness of health risks, demonstrate healthy habits and promote organizational benefits and community resources. We will invite community partners and connect attendees to available resources.
Fall Front Porch Sign Paint Class	Come join us as Shelby Hess teaches us how to paint the perfect fall pumpkin front porch sign to welcome your guests.
Prescription Drug Plans & Senior Citizens	Mr. Sam Daniel, RPh, will guide us through part lecture/part workshop to learn about the process of Medicare Open Enrollment that is during October 14-December 7. There will also be a Rx drug discussion.

Her personal medicinal herb collection has reached over 150 varieties of trees, shrubs, and plants that can be used to help heal the body and increase ones' quality of life with safe, natural homeopathic remedies. She'll share not only how to successfully grow herbs, but to go a step further into turning living plants into medicinal products that can help with everyday things like insomnia, anxiety, and boosting one's immune system. Since 1927, we are home to one of the oldest community-based holiday celebrations in the country. Starting as a one-day festival, the Natchitoches Christmas Festival has evolved into a six-week long Christmas Season. The Christmas Season begins on the Saturday before Thanksgiving and concludes on January the 6th, the Epiphany. Over 300,000 lights and 100 plus set pieces are on display every night at dusk.
